
# St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel Community Network

This document sets out headline figures for the St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel Community Network Area (CNA) highlighting how it compares to Cornwall across a variety of topics. Community network figures have been built from neighbourhood data. Availability of parish data is limited.

**St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel Community Network** has 19,270 residents; 3.6% of Cornwall's total population. The workday population is 17,626 so 1,644 people (net) commute out of the network to work.


# Network population growth 2001 – 2011

# Single person households (%) (Census 2011)

The number of adults living alone is increasing as lifestyles change and people live longer. This can contribute to housing demand.





913 households live in social rented housing in the St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel CNA which is lower (11%) than Cornwall (12%) as shown in the chart left. The range across the neighbourhoods is highest (32.5%) in St Blazey West (297 properties) and lowest (0.3%) in Tywardreath South and Par (3 properties).

5,958 homes are owned or shared ownership (71.6%) compared with 69.6% average in Cornwall. The range across the neighbourhoods shows highest concentration (10.1%) is St Blazey South (600 properties) and the lowest is (4.1%) St Blazey West (242 properties).

Homechoice is the register to apply for social housing vacancies and affordable housing in Cornwall. This information is intended as a guide only. Data includes only those currently living in Cornwall. Some people may require a connection to a local area and may not be eligible for housing.

Deprivation (Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2010, HMRC 2012/13)

8.3% of people in the St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel Community Network live in a highly deprived area, (in the top 20% most deprived in England) compared with an average of 9.8% across Cornwall. 17.7% of children aged under 16 in St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel CNA are living in poverty compared with 18.1% across Cornwall.

Not every person in a highly deprived area will themselves be deprived. Equally, there will be some deprived people living in the least deprived areas.

There is variation across the Network with some areas ranked as more than deprived than others. The following neighbourhood is ranked in the top 20% most deprived in England:

• St Blazey West

People in deprived areas are more likely to have a lower life expectancy and spend more of their life in poor health, having higher illness and disease levels.

Healthy weight (National Child Measurement Programme 2012/13 and QOF

#### Disease Register 2012/13)

16.0% of children leaving primary school in St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel CNA are obese, while a further 14.7% are classed as overweight. This compares with an average of 16.3% obese and 14.7% overweight across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly.

Figures for adult obesity are not available by community network. GP clinical registers for Cornwall indicate 13.4% of patients aged 16 and over were obese (BMI of 30 or over).

#### Natural and cultural assets (Cornwall Council July 2014)

This network is dominated by anciently enclosed land comprising medieval field systems, scattered settlements and a few larger villages. There are several stately homes with late medieval features such as the deer park at Boconnoc. The South Coast is listed as part of Cornwall AONB<sup>1</sup>. The Par-St Blazey area and the Luxulyan Valley, within the Cornish Mining World Heritage Site, contain a wealth of industrial archaeology including the Treffry Viaduct. Areas listed as an AGHV<sup>2</sup> within this network include Bodwen, Menadue, Helman Tor, Luxulyan Valley, Treskilling, Lestoon and Trearrup. SSSIs<sup>3</sup> for this area incluce Luxylyan Quarry, Breney Common, Red Moor, Redlake Meadows, Hogg's Moor and Boconnoc Park and woods,

**Neighbourhood development plans** (Cornwall Council July 2014) There is currently one neighbourhood development plan in production for St Blaise.

#### Community assets (Cornwall Council July 2014)

There are two assets listed as an Asset of Community Value within this network; St Blazey football club and Philip Varcoe sports ground.

### **Employment by sector**

There are significantly more people working in the arts, entertainment and recreation industry (10.2%) in the St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel network area than the Cornwall average (5.3%). Furthermore there are more people working in the accommodation and food services sector, with 12.7% of the network area workforce compared to the Cornwall average that has 9.5%.

#### **Economic activity**

There are less people employed (44.9%) in the network than the Cornwall average (47.1%) but slightly more in self-employment.

In addition, there are more retired people (20.9%) compared to the Cornwall average (18.9%) which is reflected in the older population profile graph on page 1.

An estimated 2.2% of young people aged 16-19 are not in education, employment or training in the network, compared to the Cornwall average of 3% (March 2014).

### Qualifications

There are slightly more (21%) people (aged 16+) with NVQ Level 2 (GCSE D-G equivalent) in the St Blazey, Fowey and Lostwithiel CNA and more people with no qualifications (15%) than the Cornwall average (20% and 13%).
